

Appendix I Summary of Conditions for Sailing on West Baldwin Reservoir

A full set of the Conditions imposed by the Isle of Man Water and Sewerage Authority is available from the Officer of the Day.

Pollution Boats and launching trollies must be sterilised inside and out using the solution provided. This process must be repeated for any boat on its return, having been taken from the site.

No area on or around the reservoir is to be used for toilet purposes. Facilities may be available at the Ardwhallin Outdoor Education Centre.

No pollution of the water is permitted. N.B. On conviction, a fine of up to £5,000 can be imposed.

Swimming is prohibited except in emergency.

Dogs or other pets are not permitted on the reservoir or its land.

Safety Adequate buoyancy aids and a wet or dry suit must be worn by all sailors.

Launching is not permitted unless a rescue boat with a crew of two is in operation. Buoyancy aids must be worn by the crew.

No boat may go nearer than 100 feet (31 metres) from the Valve Tower, situated near the dam wall at the southern end of the reservoir.

All Boats must comply with class regulations concerning buoyancy.

Not more than 30 boats are permitted afloat at any one time.

Environment Animal and plant life on and around the reservoir must not be harmed.

Except in an emergency boats must land only at the area near the entrance gate.

Care must be taken to avoid erosion of the soil banks around the reservoir.

Fishing from a boat is not permitted.
